5. SEA Ranch 14 (Burbank Housing Development Corporation) – HOME Loan Forgiveness and Conversion to Affordable Homeownership

Yesenia Lemus, Community Development Program Coordinator, and Krista Fotou, Affordable Housing Finance Program Coordinator, collaborated with Burbank Housing Development Corporation to present a proposal for a HOME loan forgiveness related to the Sea Ranch 14 project.

Subject: Substantial Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2024-25 Annual Action Plan

The Sonoma County Community Development Commission (SCCDC) issued a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME, Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), HOME-American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP), and Low- and Moderate-Income Housing Asset Fund (LMIHAF) funds on November 17, 2023, with funding proposals due to the SCCDC by January 8, 2024. The SCCDC FY 2024-25 Federal Funding Policies define the proposal selection process, the specific objectives and criteria used to review proposals, application deadlines, and the roles of the various review bodies. The Community Development Committee (CD Committe) and Cities and Town Advisory Committee (CTAC) held a concurrent public hearing on February 14, 2024, and recommended funding for a combined total of \$3,911,854 to support the activities listed in the FY 2024-25 Annual Action Plan. These funding recommendations were published for a 30-day public comment period and a concurrent public hearing was held by the committees on March 20, 2024. All comments were considered and included in the Action Plan submissions to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Following the hearing, the committees voted to confirm the funding recommendations made on February 14, 2024, and recommended approval to the Board of Supervisors (BOS). The BOS approved the FY 2024-25 Annual Action Plan on June 4, 2024.

HOME funds in the amount of \$261,662 were awarded to Jamboree Housing Corporation for the proposed Saggio Hills Phase I Affordable Housing Project in the City of Healdsburg. Jamboree Housing Corporation has declined the award due to the Build America Buy America (BABA) requirements. The SCCDC plans to reprogram these funds to the Sonoma County Housing Authority to support the Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Program (TBRA). The Housing Authority provides rental assistance through a variety of TBRA programs, which serve low-income populations. The Housing Authority will use said funds to provide low-income





clients with rental assistance and rental deposit assistance grants. Rental assistance and deposits are often a barrier to access housing for low-income households. Providing rent and deposit assistance will help low-income vulnerable populations overcome this barrier.

The draft Substantial Amendment to the FY 2024-25 Action Plan was prepared for a 30-day comment period, as required by HUD. The comment period started on February 14, 2025, and concluded on March 19, 2025. Following the public comment period and the recommendation of the CD Committee and CTAC, the draft Action Plan Substantial Amendment will go to the BOS for approval.

Requested Action: Staff is requesting the CD Committee and CTAC make a recommendation for the BOS approval of the Substantial Amendment to the FY 2024-25 Action Plan.
